Pastor's Report 2017

Associate Pastor for Children, Youth and Families

Looking back at 2017, it felt very full. There were plenty of things happening. Since many activities have been reported by the Christian Education and Youth Ministry Committees, I won't belabor readers with redundant information - please read those annual reports. Nonetheless, there are a few things I would like to add with regard to our intentional ministries for Christian formation.

Our Children's Ministry supported the idea of reaching out and connecting with Emerson Elementary School for their after-school tutoring. In January 2017, a group of dedicated volunteers from Federated Church went to Emerson on a weekly basis to help students with homework for an hour - thank you to Chris Dixon, Cindee Wachter, Anjel Garcia Lopez, Ethan Yang and Lucas Miller.

Children's Ministry partnered with the First United Methodist Church for the annual Vacation Bible Camp (VBC) during the first full week of June. It was wonderful to see our children - and many other children - gathered together and excited to learn more about God's Word. Thank you to all our volunteers and teacher Kristi Wolfe, our VBC coordinator for the past two years. During the summer months (when there is normally no Sunday school), children were provided snacks and kid-friendly activities after their sermon - thank you to Sunnie Yang and Macyn Norris.

We made a change to when our Confirmation classes meet. Instead Sunday mornings during the education hour, confirmands now meet each other week on Sunday evenings for a couple hours. I would like to thank the Gausman, Lange and Norris families for willing to try something different. One of the many benefits of this change is the feasibility of doing more activities with confirmands (Annie L., Macyn N. & Riley G.). We helped Women's Fellowship with posting signs for Cookies N More, sorted cans for recycling and prepared a meal for the Columbus Rescue Mission. Another benefit is the formation of a 7th & 8th grade class for Sunday mornings. Thank you to Brenda Sand and Lisa Perrin for accepting the challenge to teach our new middle school group. There are plenty of activities mentioned in the Youth Ministry Committee report. But one thing that was not shared - and should not be overlooked - is Doug Williams' service as a youth teacher. Doug requested to step down from teaching with the recent graduating class. While it was tempting to say no, I knew that he did not make this decision lightly. Thus his request was accepted and we want to thank Doug for his many years decades of service to our Youth Ministry. Visitation: We connect with families who have experienced hospitalization or loss. Regularly scheduled visitations are made with people who are unable to attend church services. Many visits include small gifts of food, baked goods, or flowers.

Prayer Chain: Prayer is a powerful practice as we extend support to the Federated Church family. This year we added prayer request cards in the pew racks.

Card Ministry: Pastor Edward worked with the youth to create note cards for our continuing card ministry. We also send thank you notes to people who make a memorial contribution to the Federated Church.

Spiritual Growth: The Order provides several publications to support the spiritual lives of our church family. They include: <u>These Days</u>; <u>CareNotes</u>; <u>I'm OK</u>; <u>Holiday Grief</u>; and HomeTouch Ministry devotions and activity sheets.

Flower Power: We deliver plants to homebound members and nursing homes following the Christmas and Easter services. We participate in the annual Necrology Service by reciting the names of those who have died in the past year and honoring their memory with a white rose.

Blue Christmas Service: This was our second year to host a chili supper before the Blue Christmas Service.

New This Year: A resource has been created listing local in home assistance for those providing care for loved ones. Brochures listing senior living options in Columbus are also available.

Members of the OSA extend Christian love and support in far more ways than reported here. This is often done in private. With God's help, we strive to share our blessings and serve with humility.

PLATTE COUNTY FOOD PANTRY REPORT

The Food Pantry was founded in 1975 by a Federated Church member, Hugh Gross. It quickly became a community effort. Housed at Federated Church until our church renovation, it is now housed at the northwest end of the Family Resource Center at the corner of 19thst. and 32ave.

In 1994 a Board of Directors was formed, made up or representatives of area churches and service clubs. The officers for 2018 –President-Chris Dixon, Vice President-Holly Recek, Secretary-Louise Moran, Treasurer-Mary Frauendorfer. Other members of the board are: Cecilia Bartholomew, Cecil Jones, Edwin Kosch, Sandy Fisher, Shannon Dush. Jackson Moore is the Executive Director.

Donations from churches, service clubs, schools, scouts, and other organizations and individuals in the area are received throughout the year. The Can-Care-A-Van annually held in June brings in a large part of donations for the support of the pantry. Approximately 60,000 lbs. of food was received during the past Can-Care-A-Van. This was more than the previous year. There are several other agencies in Columbus who collect and distribute food.

Through an anonymous donation during "The Big Give" from the United Way we received a donation to be used to feed those who might not be able to get to the pantry. A Back Pack for elderly program was developed. Individuals who signed up at low income housing would have bags of nonperishable items delivered. This was a once or twice delivery. The program continued in 2017 with an increase in numbers served.

Through September 2017, 1163 individuals (452) families were helped. It has become necessary to purchase some staple foods. Monetary and food donations are always welcome.

Federated members volunteer as board members, interviewers and sackers. The Federated Church has always been a great supporter of the Food Pantry and we appreciate the continued support.

Youth Ministries Committee Report

The following are highlights from 2017:

Youth clubs continue to meet on Wednesday after school and evening. Afterschool programs focused on more intentional activities, such as learning to bake, and is attended by kids in middle school. This time also serves as mission, as food is shared with the Rescue Mission. The evening group, which is attended by more high school students, uses the curriculum "Echo the Story" which is a more reflective-style curriculum. While the youth clubs meet on Wednesdays, Confirmation class meets on Sunday evenings twice a month. The Confirmation curriculum is in video/workbook/discussion format.

During January and into early February, the youth held their annual book sale. Many of the books that were not sold were donated to Columbus Public Library for their book sales throughout the year, as well as boxed up to be forwarded to Margie Heier in Africa.

In early February, nine youth travelled to Lincoln to attend service at Good Shepherd Church. Youth from our church and Good Shepherd then went bowling at UNL East Campus.

The Taste of Federated fundraiser was held February 12th, with around 17 "chefs" participating. Members were asked to bring sample sizes of their specialty food to share with Federated members and friends. Many delicious foods were shared, with the winner taking home a trophy and the runner up, a medal.

Nine youth participated in the 30-hour famine February 24th-February 25th. There were games, a program, and prayer time to keep the kids busy. They then ate breakfast Saturday morning. There were funds raised that were sent to World Vision for the 30-hour famine. Thanks to Max Porter and Antonio Garcia for helping.

On Easter Sunday, an egg hunt was held; confirmands and a few high school students helped with this.

On May 6th, three youth helped a church member with yard work.

Confirmation was held Sunday, May 7th. Those confirmed were: Anjel Garcia Lopez (Jeremy West--mentor), Beatriz Garcia Lopez (Sue Mares--mentor), Elizabeth Sand (Katie Claus-mentor), and Ethan Yang (John McClure-mentor).

On Sunday, May 14th, the youth held a flower sale for Mother's Day.

Graduates were recognized on Sunday, May 21st. There were five 2017 graduates: Brady Hanks, Ben Lange, Riley Lyon, Jenna Mares, and Regan Rine.

In June, in preparation for the mission trip to Estes Park, Colorado, mission training was held the week of June 12-June 16. It included teambuilding, making lunch, eating together, and prayer. The Needlecraft Prayer Ministry was organized in February of 2011. It's purpose is to pray for individuals while working on gifts of comfort. The idea for this ministry came from the Prayer Shawl Ministry but we have expanded it to include sewing, cross stitch, and embroidery projects as well as knitted and crocheted projects, to include more people.

Gifts have gone to military personnel, individuals, the Center for Survivors, Teen Moms, and Medical missions. We have gifted our preschoolers and 3rd graders with bookmarks when they received their Bibles. We also make the baptismal banners given at the time of baptism. Other Items made include Chemo Caps, Alzheimer activity blankets, Reusable Sanitary kits for girls as well as diapers, hospital gowns, baby hats and blankets. New projects include Red baby hats for the American Heart Assn., port pillows and "anti ouch" pouches which were distributed to cancer patients at the Columbus Community Hospital.

FEDERATED CHURCH FOUNDATION REPORT

The Federated Church of Columbus Foundation, Inc. was started in 1998 as a 501(c)(3) private foundation, organized exclusively for religious, charitable and educational purposes. As such, the Foundation can handle a wide array of charitable giving.

The Foundation administers the funds held from the generous donation of Mr. Philip Wilson. Mr. Wilson was a Federated Church member in his youth and later a successful attorney in Dallas. Upon his death in 1998, he left a bequest to the "Foundation created by Federated Church" for the express purpose of establishing a permanent endowed scholarship fund. The Foundation awards scholarships for post-high school vocational training and undergraduate studies for up to five years.

The original gift has grown by over \$170,000 to around \$850,000 in assets near the end of 2017. The Foundation has awarded 615 scholarships since distributions started in 2000. In the 18 years of existence, approximately \$719,100 in scholarships has been awarded for the youth of our Church.

In 2017, 4 total scholarships were awarded to new area high school graduates and an additional 20 renewal scholarships were awarded. The scholarship amount was \$1,750 per award.

The directors of the Foundation for 2017 were: Larry Mares - President, Tim Rathje - Treasurer, Sherry Thompson - Secretary (Sherry resigned in April due to a move out of town), John Petersen – assumed the Secretary position and Brian Klevemann, who joined the Board in April.

Sam Scheidegger, Wilma Arp and Duane Munson served on the Scholarship Committee.

Assisting the Foundation: Terry Millard serves as asset management; Tom Grubaugh performs accounting and tax preparation services; Clark Grant provides legal counsel; and Jim Rains serves as a part-time executive assistant.

2017 ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE REPORT As of 12-31-2017

In 2008, the Endowment Committee was established as a stand-alone committee, spinning off from the Property and Finance Committee. The main purpose of the Endowment Committee is to enhance the mission and outreach of Federated Church beyond the general obligation of the congregation. Another purpose of the committee is to encourage and promote gifts to the Endowment, and to invest, reinvest and administer the funds. Original committee members were Clark Grant, Terry Norris, Dave Lange, John Lohr and Lynn Higgins, who all served from 2008 through the end of 2013.

2017 committee members were; John Novotny-Chairman and member-at-large, Gail Wurdeman-member-at-large, John Hahn-member-at-large, Rick Porter-Governing Council representative, and Pat Anderson-Property and Finance Committee representative. Terry Millard continues to be the investment advisor/ agent for the invested funds.

There are four main categories of fund distributions from the Endowment, those being <u>Christian Education</u>, <u>Community Service and Outreach</u>, <u>Wider Mission of</u> <u>Federated Church</u>, and <u>Capital Improvements</u>. Additionally, the Governing Council may also approve fund distributions for other purposes. The Endowment Committee receives, reviews and recommends requests for funding, but the Governing Council approves all funds in and out of the Endowment.

During 2017, the Committee was active by meeting on 7-30-2017, as part of the 5th Sunday Pot Luck, as did most of the Church committees on that day. The meeting had no specific agenda, but we did re-affirm the members and their terms. Below are the agreed upon terms:

John Novotny – Member at large (17) – 2nd and final term ends 12-31-2017.

John Hahn – Member at large (18) – 1st term ends 12-31-2018 and he can serve one more 3-year term ending 12-31-2021.

Gail Wurdeman – Member at large (19) – 1st term ends 12-31-2019 and she can serve one more 3-year term ending 12-31-2022.

The Governing Council and Property and Finance Committee will both make their appointments to the Endowment for 2018 as appropriate, which were currently held by Rick Porter and Pat Anderson respectively.

As of 12-31-2017, the Endowment Fund balance was \$223,637.02. Below is a brief summary of the fund history:
