### From the Pastor's Desk

[based on homily shared at final 2019 Lenten Lunch]

"Are we there yet?" If you have ever been on a road trip with children, it is something you would have heard repeated countless times. It can get downright annoying. But if we can get past the repetitiveness, then maybe we can recognize a longing for something more than knowing how near the destination is.

In Hebrews 11:8-16, Abraham, Sarah and others are presented as exemplars of the faith who are seeking a destination. In Genesis 12:1, God instructed Abram (before his name change) to "Leave your land, your family, and your father's household for the land that I will show you." Abraham obeyed: "He went out without knowing where he was going." (Hebrews 11:8)

It takes courage to leave what is familiar and enter the unknown. My family came to the U.S. from South Korea when my brother and I were very young – I was six years old while my brother was close to his fourth birthday. I did not appreciate what my parents went through until the tail end of my teenage years. After years of complaining about not getting what I wanted, I realized how much my parents had given up for the sake of my brother and me. They came to a new country without knowing the language or culture. Yet, they worked hard to start a new life here. They did things that I am not sure if I would have been able to do. For example, as recent immigrants, they owned and operated a diner in a rough part of downtown Los Angeles. Along with a high level of crime in the area, my parents faced the challenges of doing things they were not familiar with. My dad worked in the front of the diner as waiter taking orders with his broken English while my mom worked in the back as cook making American diner dishes.

It is hard to imagine how they managed, especially since my mom does not eat meat and would not have known what even a hamburger is supposed to taste like. When I asked her how she cooked American food, my mom said she had to learn quickly because it had to be done. I am sure there are many stories within our congregation of ancestors who immigrated to the U.S. and worked hard to start a new life for their family.

"Are we there yet?" Abraham was not content with settling in the land that God promised (Hebrews 11:9). He lived as a nomad with his descendants. Abraham was longing for a home that is not of this world (verse 10). Similarly, there are two allegorical tales that have been formative in my spiritual life. As a young Christian, I read John Bunyan's *Pilgrim's Progress*. This classic novel describes the winding journey of the main character, Christian, in overcoming numerous trials and temptations to reach his destination – the Celestial City.

The other story is Dante Alighieri's *Divine Comedy*, which I read for a doctoral seminar. In this epic poem, Dante (as the main character) travels through many levels of hell and purgatory before ascending to Paradise.

The two stories provide insights to our spiritual journey. In *Pilgrim's Progress*, Christian and his companion, Hopeful, arrive close to their final destination. In order to reach the Celestial City, they need to cross the River of Death. The depth of the river changes based on the level of one's faith in Christ. When Christian initially steps in, he sinks and is afraid that he will drown. Yet, Hopeful reminds him of God's promises, specifically that when we pass through the waters, God will be with us (Isaiah 43:2). From that point, Christian is able to get his head above the water and reach shore. They reach their final destination. Like Abraham, our true home is not "the country we had left" but rather "the heavenly country" (Hebrews 11:15-16).

In the Divine Comedy, Dante experiences a beatific vision as he reaches the gates of Paradise. It is the love of his earthly life, Beatrice, who welcomes him into heaven. This is a reminder that God has blessed us with many joys and loves in this world, which are a foretaste of the great joy and love we will experience for eternity.

Likewise, Sarah and Abraham received God's promise – specifically of having children (Hebrews 11:11). While the promise was fulfilled on earth, there was a complete fulfillment in heaven.

The starting point of our spiritual journeys are varied. Some of you might be cradle Christians, attending church from time you were in your mother's womb. Other, like myself, came to know Christ as a young person after some years of wandering. And there might be even some who came to Christ as an older adult. For each of these, we can give God thanks because we are seeking the same destination. We are "looking forward to a city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God" (Hebrews 11:10). With that sense of longing, I will ask one more time, "Are We There Yet?"

Thanks be to God!

### Hebrews 11:8-16 (Common English Bible)

8 By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was going to receive as an inheritance. He went out without knowing where he was going. 9 By faith he lived in the land he had been promised as a stranger. He lived in tents along with Isaac and Jacob, who were coheirs of the same promise. 10 He was looking forward to a city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. 11 By faith even Sarah received the ability to have a child, though she herself was barren and past the age for having children, because she believed that the one who promised was faithful. 12 So descendants were born from one man (and he was as good as dead). They were as many as the number of the stars in the sky and as countless as the grains of sand on the seashore. 13 All these people died in faith without receiving the promises, but they saw the promises from a distance and welcomed them. They confessed that they were strangers and immigrants on earth. 14 People who say this kind of thing make it clear that they are looking for a homeland. 15 If they had been thinking about the country that they had left, they would have had the opportunity to return to it. 16 But at this point in time, they are longing for a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore, God isn't ashamed to be called their God—he has prepared a city for them.
