From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends.

Jesus' beginning was humble and uneventful – while a lot of people might have seen the bright star over Bethlehem, that did not mean that there was a crowd at the manger. Jesus, like human leaders throughout all of time, had to have certain leadership traits, but people also needed time for trust in him to be built and time to experience his compassion and teaching.

There is a lot of disappoint in leadership today. Misconduct and rancor dwell beside just plain rudeness, which has somehow become acceptable, even from the highest civic offices in the land.

Churches and church leaders are not exempt from people's disappointment. Scandals in Roman Catholic, Protestant, and Evangelical churches have sad histories of leaders who disappointed people, too. People also have very mixed feelings about the influences between leadership in secular and religious spheres.

We expect that people achieve leadership positions by showing commitment, good character, and fortitude over the long haul. We sometimes say that someone is a "natural born leader," because she or he has inherent leadership traits, but time is also needed for trust to be built and experience to be gained.

The arrival of Jesus — *where* he arrived — and *how* he arrived — as an infant as vulnerable as any of us — was something of a disappointment. Most people who expected the Messiah to arrive in the pomp and circumstance of royalty, or the triumphant victory of a political or military conqueror.

Because of Jesus — his unique arrival and his even more unique life — Christians should expect things to be "shaken up." Ours is a faith of surprises – Mary was surprised by Gabriel, Joseph was surprised by life, the Apostle Paul was surprised on the road to Emmaus. The difference between Jesus' surprising life — and Mary's, and Joseph's and Paul's — was that they did not live for themselves. Their leadership, sometimes public (Jesus and Paul), sometimes private (Mary and Joseph), was not to build themselves up. It was to glorify God, and to be a part of building God's reign of justice, peace, and love.

At Christmas, we celebrate Jesus' birth, which was a unique kind of leadership of the world. It was humble leadership. It was vulnerable leadership. It showed people God's love. Let's look for that in one another — at Christmas — and always.






