We learned about church being held in homes and why, and we visited three home churches. We helped with a handicapped ministry and visited in the home of a handicapped young man, allowing us to witness the staggering poverty and hopelessness of the people. We bought rice, beans, and oil and packaged them to give to the mothers at the handicapped ministry; we visited an orphanage and were moved to offer three electric fans for them, as they had only one and it was very hot and humid. Our leaders, after going to 5 stores, found only one. We worked on a pineapple farm planting coffee trees and guava trees. We went to Havana and noticed so many differences between the city and the places where we worked, the small villages. We learned so much. We heard the people, who have so very little, praising God for what they had. We learned that people all over respond to smiles, hugs, and handshakes. We learned that the freedom we have should never be taken for granted, and always cherished. We were so thankful that God used us in Cuba, and we sincerely thank the congregation for its help and support. Investing in our young people is the best use of our money, I believe. You would all have been so proud of this group!
