"How Does Federated Church Taste?"

Our middle child used to make an interesting comment after eating delicious food. He would often say it "tastes beautiful." That was an odd description since "beautiful" is not normally used in relation to the sense of taste. Rather it most often describes something that one sees - and possibly what one hears.

Yet, I have also been struck by what seems like peculiar uses of the verb "taste." One of our youth members, Reagan Gausman wonderfully sang "I Shall Not Want" (written by Audrey Assad & Bryan Brown) in worship a couple Sundays ago. Within the song were these words: "When I taste Your goodness, I shall not want." This is a reference to Bible verses that speak of tasting that God is good (for example, I Peter 2:3).

What does it mean to "taste" God? It seems like an odd action word in relation to God. As Protestants, we tend to think of hearing or listening to God - whether through Scripture, sermons or songs. While we focus on the auditory sense, other Christian traditions emphasize sight by seeing God through the visual arts. Of course, the sense of taste has a role in the Christian practice of celebrating the Lord's Supper. However, it does not appear that the psalmist had this sacrament in mind when writing "O taste and see that the Lord is good" (Psalm 34:8).

Once again, what does it mean to "taste" God? I would surmise that tasting in this context has to do with experiencing the world at a fundamental level. We begin to taste food from infancy. Studies even show that a baby's sense of taste is more sensitive than an adults - with a greater distribution of taste buds. What we eat during our early years affects what we like to eat in our older years. My wife and I are noticing how each of our three kids have distinct palates; there are certain foods that one likes while the others clearly dislike. It is interesting to observe how their food preferences are changing. For example, our older kids are developing an appetite for spicy foods. And, while there are certain vegetables that they still do not like, they are trying more varieties.

Thinking about developing taste buds, I wonder about the children in Federated Church and how they "taste" (in other words, experience) God, church, faith... Are they experiencing worship in ways that will lead to positive cravings for church as they grow up? Or, will they have an aversion to things that resemble what they know of church from their childhood?

While we cannot control what our kids will like - or dislike - to eat, we can make an impact by providing nutritious foods prepared deliciously. Similarly, our Children's Ministry teachers, music staff and I have tried to do provide enriching experiences throughout the past year with Bible lessons, songs and crafts. Last week, we had Vacation Bible School with First United Methodist Church and St. Luke's United Church of Christ. The weeklong VBS can be thought of as a spiritual smorgasbord for children with various activities. Through both the weekly and occasional feasts, my hope is that all the children of Federated Church would say that our church "tastes beautiful!"
