



From the Pastor's Desk

For this month's newsletter article, I asked permission from one of our high school members to share something she wrote. Elizabeth "Lizzy" Sand, a senior at Lakeview High School, wrote this speech on kindness. She has an important message for all of us to hear. Please read with an open mind and heart. The age old saying, "kill them with kindness," is one everyone has heard. This oxymoron is an odd saying because kindness and killing do not go together at all, but in this instance, it works so well to teach us one of the most important things that anyone can ever learn. Obviously, we're not going to literally kill the person in question with kindness, because that wouldn't be very kind. The lesson this saying really teaches is that the best way to kill someone's hurtful words or attitude, is with kindness. I feel like sometimes we forget that. Somehow, we've gotten it into our heads that if we just add fuel to the flames, that at some point the other person will run out of fuel. The person who can sling the most hate, land the most blows, hurt the other more, wins. This is simply absurd.




Let me tell you a quick little short story, it won't take much time, but it is one the wisest things I've ever heard and I will always remember that moment for the rest of my life. Now grandma Sand is Catholic and very involved at her church. For those of you who don't know, she was diagnosed with cancer. I don't know if it's that, or just me getting older that she now voices her opinions to me more, but either way I love it. We were sitting in the lounge area of her home and I



honestly cannot remember what spiked the conversation but we were on the topic of gay people. I had a feeling she didn't agree with the LGB [lesbian, gay, bisexual], and I was trying to prepare myself for what I would respond with if she said something negative because some of my very best friends are gay. ...

So, she turned to me and said, "Now I don't love the way they live," and I thought I'd have to confront my grandma which is something I never want to do, then she finished her thought with the kindest tone, "But we don't have to love the way they decide to live, we can just love them." Let me repeat that for you, "Now I don't love the way they live, but we don't have to love the way they decide to live, we can just love them." That sentence right there applies to so much more than LGB issues. It applies to everyday issues. It preaches the love that God wants us to give.



I feel like we're all too quick to judge one another. I was too quick to judge my own grandma when we were having that talk in the lounge. Little did I know she was actually going to say something that will stick with me for the rest of my life. That's the thing isn't it, the most important life lessons come when you least expect them to. Sometimes it takes very unpleasant occurrences to teach us something valuable.

You have no way of knowing what people are going through, even if they tell you how they're feeling, they'll always keep some of that to themselves. Because of this we always have to keep in mind that something you say can make or break someone's day. You don't know if that little comment will send them over the edge, but we do know that a kind word can change someone's entire day or even their life. In the same way that negative comments can ruin someone's day or their life. And if someone comes at you, and they say or do something that makes you feel not so great, either say something kind or ignore it. Whatever you do, do not react with hate in your heart. Often times, people who are mean to others are hurting somehow. Sadly, being mean to others is somewhat of a defense mechanism. We have to try to be aware of ourselves, and make sure we do not use this defense mechanism. God did not put us on this earth to treat each other poorly, and I promise you that if you ask for God's help in being kind and gracious, God will help.

Stewardship Week 1

Stewardship Week 2

Much like the ancient audience for whom the words of Isaiah 61 were originally spoken, faith communities are in a familiar but new place. Like those who faced rebuilding Jerusalem, many of us feel that our beloved churches have suffered the brunt of attack, and we wonder if it's even possible to rebuild them so they will be around for more than another generation.

The words of Isaiah 61 call us to a different path, one of action and faith. The prophet's message was not a call to grasp at security or embrace complacency. These were words of challenge, risk, and service. Is not this message still relevant for us today?

To respond to this call to ministry we will have to take off our mourning clothes and take the risk of being generous, in order to bring about this realization of God's will.

Stewardship Week 3

Romans 12 does not offer a unicorn-esque view of transformation as stewardship. before we can care for people and their existential reality, we must examine the world and who we are in this world. The product of such examination ought to be a desire to enhance and improve our personal state so that how we live in this world and how we perceive this world changes.

Transformation as stewardship is not complacency with the world's current offering. We march for justice. We protest with our feet and with our prayers. We hope with our actions against anything that is inhumane and non-life giving or life affirming.

What hope for the world is there if the church community genuinely cares for the needs of others, but lacks its own hope?


