The persistent question for Christians is: who is my neighbor? We might spend a lot of time trying to discern who is my neighbor, but we know from Jesus' life and ministry that what Jesus really means is that everyone is our neighbor. This is inconvenient. This is difficult.

Federated Church has as its physical neighbors several businesses, a bank, the courthouse. The Federated Church building has been designated as an emergency evacuation location for the courthouse. We hope that is never needed, but we are glad to be able to be a good neighbor in this way.

One of the many tough things to figure out about how to be a good neighbor is how much of someone's personal "business" we should be privy to. This is something I have been thinking about during the month of October, because October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month. **continues on page 2 —>**

Columbus' Center for Survivors of Domestic Abuse and Sexual Assault.

One hope I have is that Lia can help us understand how to be good neighbors to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. I hope she can also help us to understand how to be good neighbors to perpetrators of domestic violence and sexual assault. This is especially difficult, but unless we address the shame and guilt felt by both perpetrators and victims, we make little to no progress towards ending the cycle of violence.

As I reflected on who is my neighbor, I reached out to Federated's immediate neighbors this week. I sent a letter to the staff of the DA Davidson office, which is across the street to the east of the church. I also sent a letter to the staff of the law offices that are across the street to the south of the church. Here is a portion of the letters:

### Women's Fellowship in Transition Submitted by Linda Wheatley

Women's Fellowship has been around for a long time. But maybe it's time for that to end. The official "mission" of Women's Fellowship has been to foster and encourage Christian fellowship and spiritual growth among the women of the church, to support the church and to provide outreach to those in need locally and around the world.

So what does that look like? Christian fellowship and spiritual growth happens through small groups (Circles, Needlepoint Ministry) and larger groups events—although those larger groups events—meetings, programs and dinners—aren't very large because attendance has declined in recent years. Providing outreach includes fund raising which is done through the annual all church garage and bake sale, "Cookies 'N More", and circle donations and then distributing the funds raised to local, national and international charities.

Support for the church includes organizing the funeral committees who prepare and serve funeral meals; monitoring the kitchen to keep supplies (such as coffee, paper products, etc.) available and conducting an annual kitchen clean-up day, and maintaining the church library and reading program.

### Women's Fellowship in Transition Submitted by Linda Wheatley

Community outreach projects include delivering Meals on Wheels, donating cookies for the Bloodmobile, assisting with Bingo at skilled care centers and helping serve Lenten Lunches.

The problem with Women's Fellowship is finding people to step up and assume leadership roles. The women who have been serving in those leadership roles have done it for a very long time. For various reasons they have indicated they will not continue in 2018.

What would our church look like if all those things described above just disappeared? So, what will happen? The current structure of Women's Fellowship could change.
