From the Pastor's Desk

As continuation of sharing my experience from Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE), here's my seventh reflection:

DYING – Week eight [of CPE] was a turning point for me in terms of thinking about death. I realized that I was uncomfortable with the subject of death and would avoid discussing it

with patients and their family members. This was evident to me while presenting a verbatim on my visit with the family of the 17-year-old full arrest patient. When I was talking with the patient's mother I could sense her fear that her son might die. But I avoided the subject and tried to talk about something more "lively" like her son's hobbies.

I wonder why I feel so uncomfortable about the subject of death. It might have to do with not having attended a funeral until I was in college. I did not experience the reality of death while growing up. At the same time, our family rarely talked about death. I knew my paternal grandparents died when my father was young but I did not know any of the circumstances surrounding their deaths. When death was discussed, it was often about the possibilities of death based on superstitious ideas. For example, I remember being scolded for writing my name with a red pen – because Koreans have a superstition that writing a personal name with red ink is a sign of death.

He will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; Mourning and crying and pain will be no more, For the first things have passed away." Revelation 21:4

It seems that American culture is not comfortable with death either. There are numerous euphemisms in relation to death: like "passed away," "croaked," "expired,"

"feeding the worms," and "kicked the bucket." Rather than talking directly about death, these expressions indirectly refer to the uncomfortable subject. In relation to church buildings, I am reminded of how older churches (E.g., San Gabriel Mission) have a cemetery on their property. As congregants enter their place of worship, they are visually reminded of the saints who have gone before them into death. But this connection between the living and the dead is absent in newer church facilities. It's very likely that there are municipal codes that would prevent cemeteries from being built next to church buildings now. Even if that was not the case, most people do not want to be reminded of the imminence of death.

Now, I realize that talking about someone dying is not the same as wishing death upon that someone. Rather than avoiding the subject, I need to allow space for people to feel comfortable talking about death. From a Christian perspective, I understand that death is not necessarily in conflict with life.

Essential to the gospel is the belief that Christ's death brings about new life. And I am reminded of a sona that we sung when I was growing up in church and is based on this Bible verse: "For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain." (Philippians 1:21) I'm not sure if I've really accepted the notion that "to die is gain." I feel tied to the idea that death is a loss because of the fear of being separated from loved ones. Maybe that is part of preparing for death: to move away from the focus on what might be lost to the faith on what will be gained.

Yesterday it looked so gray as raindrops fell throughout the day. it matched the way I felt because my loved one passed away. God, sometimes I have wondered if you grieve the way we do, and if those drops are really tears that you are crying too. - Anne Peterson

Here are some questions for your own reflection:

~ How do you feel about the subject of death? Have you spoken with family/friends about those feelings?

~ If you have experienced loss of loved ones, is there something that has been helpful for you in mourning that loss?

This is not an all inclusive list, any non-perishable food items are needed.




Paws & Claws Adoption Center

Bulk Emails and Mail Chimp Sign-up Instructions

Many of you are complaining about not getting the weekly bulk email (updates, funeral/memorial service information, Newsletters, etc.) After a bit of research, I have found that many third party email services have a problem with email providers considering anything coming from them is spam. (I.E. Gmail decides that the Mail Chimp is spam because it's a third party email and the 'bots' recognize it as a hacked email, although it is not.)

Once your email in the Mail Chimp database has bounced back because of this, the only option for the church staff is to <u>delete your contact</u>, we cannot update, change or alter that contact. Once a contact is deleted, however, the staff is unable to reenter it. In order for you to be able to see these emails you have to use the form on the website (shown to the right) and, in your email settings, make sure that the email fcstaff@federatedcolumbus.org is considered as a 'safe
