Re-membering the Past, Present and Future

"Remember your creator in the days of your youth..." Ecclesiastes 12:1

What is your earliest memory? Do you have fond recollections of your childhood? I have vague memories of my first six years of life in South Korea. Much of my childhood amnesia probably has to do with the early stages of brain development – in which long-term memories are not recorded. Yet, I do have some reminiscences of my adolescent years. It is an odd mix of experiences: for example, accidentally dropping something valuable between several boulders, getting hit on the head by a rock, enjoying mint candies, and being carried piggyback by my parents after preschool.

By themselves, these memories do not amount to much. Consequently, as a teenager I struggled with my identity. I felt that I knew very little about my past. Since then I have tried to learn more about my family history and ethnic heritage. This endeavor has been part of my ongoing work of finding puzzle pieces. When I was asked in a group setting to describe a snapshot of my early childhood, I responded that I did not have one. Instead, my early childhood felt like a puzzle with very few pieces in place. Thus, my experience of remembering my past is a continuing effort to fill in the picture.

I believe the church also needs to remember the past: to know where we started millennia ago, how the spiritual journey has been traveled over centuries, what has happened over past decades in our specific context and to be aware of our recent years and months. After receiving the call to serve at Federated, yet before my family moved to Columbus, I had the opportunity to read through the commemorative centennial book for our church. It was inspiring to learn about the various ways that Federated Church has been serving the community. Just as encouraging has been learning about the lived history through personal visits. I would challenge all of our church members, especially our older adults to share from their wealth of experiences at Federated Church. It would be tragic for the memories of the past to be lost.

Along with remembering the past, we are to remember in the present tense. In our communion liturgy, we are instructed to partake of the elements (that is, bread and wine) "in remembrance" of Christ. While 'to remember' usually means 'to bring to one's mind' (or 'call to mind' which is the literal translation of the Latin, rememorari), it can mean more than a mental activity. We are to "re-member" Christ in the sense that we reconnect as members of Christ's body when we celebrate the Lord's Supper. In other words, to remember means to be reunited with Christ and God's people.

As a church, we can re-member by striving for ways to be more connected. The fundamental way we are linked with one another and God is in worship. It is encouraging to see familiar yet new faces in our worship services. My hope is that we can grow more in worshiping God together. I am willing to help address any concerns that have hindered worship attendance, so please let me know what those concerns might be.

Another way we can better connect with one another is through small groups. Our Membership and Growth Committee has taken initiative in starting numerous small groups. Please take a look at the various opportunities to connect with others.

Lastly, I have been reminded of the vital work that churches are called to do in remembering for the future. Ecclesiastes 12:1 instructs us to remember God in our youthful days because it will be more difficult to do so with an increase of age and worries of life. With this in mind, I have encouraged our Children's Ministry and Youth Ministry teachers to think about ways we can help the children and youth in our care to form positive memories of church - and in turn, of God.

Based on statistics, it is probable that many of our young people will not as adults be connect to our church - or any church. Yet I have hope that fond memories of Federated Church will lead our young people to reconnect with a faith community – here or elsewhere. It is difficult to say what they will remember about growing up at Federated Church. For example, I was surprised to hear one of our recent confirmands share that his fondest memory of Sunday school was the petting zoo animals. With this in mind, our Christian Education Committee invited Horn T Zoo to bring their animals for our upcoming Education Hour Kick-Off on Sept. 8th. We will also have a free lunch prepared by our Youth Ministry Committee following worship that day.

Along with events and activities, our children and youth will remember the interactions they had with our adult members. Remembrances of being loved through encouraging words and kind deeds will make as much - if not more - of an impact in the lives of our young people.

By sharing God's love with one another, we can re-member the past, in the present and for the future.

Federated Church Opportunities for Service

GOVERNING COUNCIL – 3 persons elected for a three year term. The Governing Council is the governing board of Federated Church. Each member of the Governing Council is either a chairperson or member of a Committee, serves communion, attends denominational meeting, calls on members as needed.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION COMMITTEE - 2 persons elected for a three year term. Oversees Church School, Vacation Bible Camp, Confirmation, and Adult Ed.

FINANCE & PROPERTY COMMITTEE - 2 persons elected for a three year term. Oversees asset management and expenditure of church budget, church property, upkeep.

MEMBERSHIP & GROWTH COMMITTEE – 2 persons elected for a three year term. Oversee evangelism and outreach, including Community Publicity, Special Events, New Members.

PERSONNEL COMMITTEE - 1 person elected to a three year term.
Conducts interviews & evaluations of non-ordained candidates/staff, keeps job descriptions current, and makes recommendations to Council.
SOCIAL CONCERNS & MISSIONS COMMITTEE - 2 persons elected to a three year term. Coordinates special offerings, missions, community outreach, social advocacy, connects to community partners.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE – 1 person elected for a three year term and 1 person for a one year term Coordinates annual stewardship campaign to encourage pledging and tithing as a spiritual discipline of the whole congregation.

WORSHIP & MUSIC COMMITTEE – 2 person elected to a three year

term. Coordinates communion, special services, & musicians. Advises Pastor and Music Staff. **YOUTH MINISTRY COMMITTEE – 2 persons elected to a three year term.** Relates to pastor/director as a resource group, and reports to Governing Council concerning regular and special activities for 7th-12th grades.

ORDER OF ST. ANDREW – 3 persons elected to a three year term. Makes visits and assists with care ministry projects of the Order to members & community. NOMINATING COMMITTEE - 4 persons elected for a ONE year term. Presents annual slate of recommended names for elected offices and committee members.

ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE - 1 person elected for a THREE year term.Manages the Endowment fund and encourages and promotes gifts to the fund. Receives requests for fund distribution and makes recommendations for such distributions to the Governing Council. Committee meets as needed.


