

All are welcome to Sunday fellowship, at Café LaFed, hosted this week by Judy Temme.

Christine Dempsey completed her Master of Divinity at Dubuque Theological Seminary in May. She is coming to ministry after working for fifteen years as a lecturer in history having taught at both the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and Nebraska Wesleyan University. She earned her B.A. in music and history at Nebraska Wesleyan University. Then, she continued her education completing a M.A. and Ph.D. at the University of Nebraska in Modern European History with a specialty in the Protestant Reformation and a minor in Chinese history. Her research is on the use of hymns as teaching tools in the Protestant Reformation.

While working at the University, teaching courses in the history of the church, she felt the call to ministry. She became aware of not only the students' lack of knowledge about the physical church but also learned about their spiritual needs. After having students routinely stop by the office to share personal stories and ask spiritual questions, she became aware of God's call on her life.

Christine was born in Scottsbluff, Nebraska and attended the First Presbyterian church there where she was active in the music ministry and youth group. Since moving to Lincoln, she has been active at Westminster Presbyterian Church as a Ruling Elder, Moderator of Adult Education, and has taught the confirmation class for ten years. In helping the Head of Staff reorganize the youth program, she wrote a two-year curriculum for the confirmation class. Additionally, she headed up fund-raising for the youth mission trip to Lohmen, Germany, plans two youth retreats a year and plays trumpet with the Westminster Brass. Christy is married to Michael Dempsey, a computer Networking Presales Engineer for Sirius Computer Solutions. They have two sons, Liam who is a sophomore at Colorado School of Mines where he studies computer science, and Cael who is a sophomore at Lincoln East High school where he is involved in wresting and band. She is also a good friend of the late Rev. Lee Hicks' daughter, Kerry!
