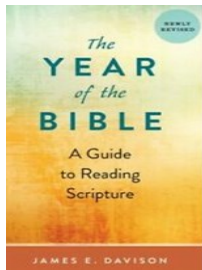

JOYS & CONCERNS

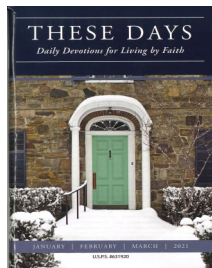
- ♦ If you have any joys or concerns, please share with the congregation by informing the office.
