*CALL TO CONFESSION

One: As a kid I used to think the prayer of confession was scary. I thought it was a moment designed to make me feel guilty, intended for eyes cast down and shoulders hung low. - All: we simply leave them unlocked, hoping folks will figure it out.
- One: Instead of telling the next generation why this night matters so much,
- All: we stay quiet, afraid of creating pressure.
- One: Forgive us for our silence.
- All: Forgive us for our hesitation.
- One: Forgive us for the moments when we fail to share your good news.
- All: Plant this story of love so deep in our bones that we cannot help but share it from generation to generation. Amen.

Homestead Presbytery: Norfolk

Like many of our churches, First PC, Norfolk has struggled to fully recover from the effects of the pandemic, especially in terms of attendance. But we are optimistic about the prospects for the coming year. First PC continues a long-time mission interest in Malawi, supporting 3 different missions in the country: Norfolk Schools, Malawi, a private Christian school founded by one of our members, Joe Mtika; the ministry of Tyler and Rochelle Holms, who are building a capability for Malawians to drill their own water wells; and a sister church relationship with the Kaphuta Church in Mzimba. We are also involved in a number of local and ecumenical ministries that include youth. Prayers for all our youth ministries and the general health of the church would be very much welcome.


