New Business:

- Approval to sell the church van. Rev. Yang and Brenda Sand will be looking to into replacement options.

Upon the recommendation of the Membership and Growth Committee, Governing Council voted to remove that list of reserved of 39 members from the Federated Church membership roll.
- Rev. Yang and Brenda Sand reported on the Presbytery meeting they attended.
- The minutes from the February 26, 2023 Congregational Meeting were approved by the Governing Council members
- Governing Council approved two applications for membership to Federated Church.
- John McPhail offered suggestions for communion servers to report to the Head Usher before the service begins
- Katie Claus with Social Concerns committee reported on the needs of the Ukrainian refugees arriving in Nebraska. They have been communicating with the Refugee Center in Lincoln and are looking into ways Federated Church can help.
- Katie Claus reviewed the works and goals of the Social Concerns Committee. Please keep this committee members and their goals in your prayers for the church this month.
- Next month the Youth Ministries and Christian Education Committees will be highlighted and reviewed by Brenda Sand and Parker Grant.

GOVERNING COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY - MARCH

The Pipe Organ Task Force presented a status update to the Governing Council:

- Survey results were presented along with the task force recommendations.
- The task force was granted another 3 months of service to continue researching standalone and hybrid electronic instruments so that they can make a recommendation to the Governing Council to open a fundraising campaign.

Finance and Property has started prioritizing and obtaining bids on "To-Do-Projects" and obtaining bids for security cameras and keyless entry door locks.

The first Service of Wholeness and Healing was held on March 5th. These services will be held quarterly.

Katie Claus and Julie Graham will be giving the church service sermon on April 13th and 16th.

Approval for Continuing Education Leave and vacation leave was approved for Pastor Yang to attend the Transitional Ministry Week 1 Training, (July 16-21). Pastor Yang will be out of the office July 10-25th. Pulpit supply will be arranged for two Sundays and accompanying Thursdays services July 13, 16, 20, & 23.

A Governing Council retreat was discussed for the purpose of developing Federated Church goals and to develop a pastor annual review process. This is to be arranged in August of 2023.

The Personnel Committee presented the Governing Council with an updated Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual which was approved.

Brenda Sand reviewed the upcoming activities and goals of the Youth Ministry Committee. A youth mission trip is being planned. Please keep the youth, the committee members, and the adults that work with the youth in your thoughts and prayers this month.

John McPhail pointed out that the task force committee on updating our church constitution and by-laws noticed that the mission statement we are currently using "We are called to nurture growing relationships with God by following the example of Jesus Christ"

is not the mission statement that is used in our Federated Church Constitution:

"The Federated Church is a group of Christians bonded together for the purpose of communicating with Christ, and with each other. Our objective is to learn about and to extend the teachings of Jesus Christ to our members and the community, through word and deed.

"Our concern is for the welfare of humanity both spiritually and physically. We strive for a healthy relationship of people to God and people to people. We seek to respond to the Gospel and to the needs around us. With God's grace we can make an effort toward providing for individual, church and community needs, while continuing to support national and world missions." The mission statement will be a focus discussion at a later date.



DECODING THE LITURGICAL COLOR SCHEME

Purple = Preparation Purple is the color that is used during our seasons of preparation: Advent and Lent. During both of these seasons (the four Sundays before Christmas and the 40 days before Easter, respectively), we are to dedicate ourselves for the preparation of our hearts and minds for welcoming Christ. Purple is also the traditional color of royalty, and so some give nod to this as a reason why we use purple during these seasons.

In some tradition, the color **blue** is used interchangeably with purple during the season of Advent.

White = Holiness We use white any time we are celebrating days that emphasize the divinity of Christ: Christmas, Easter, Baptism of the Lord, Christ the King, and so on. For the most part, if you find white paraments in the sanctuary, you are worshiping on a day that has great significance to our understanding of Jesus as God. Also, since white has come to symbolize holiness, it is also often used for the celebration of both sacraments (baptism and communion). You will also often see a pastor wear a white stole when officiating a wedding. Although there is no theological or liturgical reason, some pastors choose to do so as the colors white and black are so often associated with weddings. However, any color of stole is deemed appropriate based on the season.
