



PASTOR'S REPORT



Throughout the season of Lent and the first two Sundays of Easter (n.b., Easter is a season with seven Sundays), we have been utilizing a resource from A Sanctified Art titled "Wandering Heart." We have been looking at the faith journey of one of Jesus' most famous disciples. I have appreciated learning about Peter, from his eagerness to follow Jesus by dropping his fishing net to his boldness in walking on water and conviction in proclaim Jesus as the Messiah. Despite these faith-filled experiences, Peter also stumbled. He tried to prevent Jesus from his earthly mission and infamously denied (3 times) knowing his leader. Thankfully, God loves imperfect people. God worked through Peter who was restored to lead the nascent church. And God continues to works in us.

I hope you have been encouraged through this series. If you missed a worship service, all are available on our church website. You might have noticed that poems from A Sanctified Art were read during our Lenten services. Please let me know if you would have a printout of any poem.


