#### From the Pastor's Desk

Churches are messy. I do not mean "messy" as in untidy and lacking neatness – the way my wife would describe my office. Rather, there is something about the group of people that we refer to as a church that is prone to be harmony-challenged. Those who have served in a church leadership role likely know what I am talking about. Members of a church do not always see eye to eye; disagreements are inevitable.

However, the idea of messy churches may be counterintuitive to what we would expect. Since the Church is described as the Body of Christ, we might expect churches to always be reflective of Christ. Unfortunately, that it not often the case. Bringing together imperfect people will always lead to an imperfect group, in other words, a messy church. Sometimes, the mess could lead to unresolved conflicts and ultimately division within a church.

The reason for sharing this realistic description is that I thought the messiness of churches – and specifically, our church – might rear its head and cause some disappointing results. I felt this way at our recent Governing Council meeting (on March 23rd). There was tension in the air as various elders of the council shared their thoughts on how we should go about loosening restrictions related to the COVID-19 pandemic. It seemed like there was at least an hour worth of discussion before the realization that we could talk about this topic all night long. Rather than continuing the back-and-forth debate, motions were made, seconded, amended after more discussion and unanimously passed. The approved motions are listed in this newsletter.

While every Governing Council elder agreed with the amended motions, I would not assume that each of them fully agreed with every motion. There was a compromise among the various views on loosening restrictions with a fair amount of give and take. When it was over, I felt relieved that our council was able to work together.

As I reflect on the recent Governing Council meeting, I am reminded of a statement by the late Presbyterian pastor/seminary professor/General Assembly moderator, Jack Rogers (who grew up in Lincoln, NE): "Unity does not mean uniformity." In other words, we do not have to agree on everything to be united. There will be disagreements that we should learn to live with. There should be compromises. When compromise happens, the various parties need to focus more on what was gained as opposed to what felt like a loss. There also needs to be a greater focus on what is held in common over and against what was disagreed.

In terms of COVID-19, I think we all agree that we want the pandemic to be over. I look forward to seeing people without a mask so that I can see their smile. I look forward to handshakes during our passing the peace and after worship. I look forward to Café la Fed and potlucks. Yet, I also respect the views of our church leaders and the decisions they have made. Please review the approved motions that are listed. If you are troubled by or disagree with any of the motions, please share your thoughts by speaking with myself or an elder currently on our Governing Council.

I will conclude with the statement that I began with: churches are messy. Thankfully, God is able to make something beautiful from our mess. And I am reminded of this song, "Beautiful Things" by Gungor (song video can be found on YouTube):

Following motions were approved by Governing Council on March 23, 2021:

Effective May 24, 2021

1) Masks are recommended for all the facility/all functions.

#### Effective immediately

2) Sanctuary has open seating with a designated area to accommodate 6ft rule for those who wish.

- 3) Continue with availability of masks and hand sanitizer at entrances.
- 4) Remove roped area in narthex.
- 5) Bulletins available for services/take home when done.
- 6) Committees/groups will set their own guidelines for meetings/gatherings for masks/distance.

7) All other restrictions will remain in effect until further notice from Governing Council.

8) A congregation hymn may be sung at the end of service.
