#### **Associate Pastor's Report**

Death is a part of our temporal life. I was sheltered from this reality for much of my youth. Looking back, I realize that being in an immigrant family with just my parents and sibling, I did not have grandparents or relatives in that generation nearby. In fact, I did not know my grandparents very well. My paternal grandparents died long before I was born. I learned fairly recently that my grandfather went missing during the Korean War (1950-53). And my grandmother passed away when my father was in his early 20s (circa 1965). In comparison, my maternal grandparents lived much longer. I met my grandmother a couple times after we moved to the U.S., but I was young and could not communicate well in Korean. When she died, my mom was the only one in the family to make the trip to Korea. My grandfather on my mom's side was still alive when Sunnie and I got married in 2001. He passed away the following year. Once again, my mom was the only one to make the trip to Korea.

I did not grasp the meaning of death. I did not have anyone that I knew well and would no longer get to know. My first time actually attending a funeral service was when I was in college – till then I only knew of funerals through television shows and movies. The funeral was for my close friend's father. It felt like there was a wave of funerals I attended in my 20s. Most of them were for people I barely knew: some were for members of the large church I served as a youth pastor and others were for a parent of a friend. It wasn't until I reached my 30s when I experienced the death of someone close. My father passed away a couple weeks before my 32nd birthday. According to his birthdate on official documents, he was 59 years old. But he was born during a time in Korea when birth certificates were delayed until it was certain that the child would live. It is possible that he reached 60.

When death came for my father, my family felt relief for the end of his suffering. Within the last year of his life he went from making an international trip (to Canada) to visit Sunnie, infant Ethan and me to injuring his back while picking up luggage to getting diagnosed with multiple myeloma to visiting the VA Hospital a countless number of times for treatment to being barely able to move and eat on his own. Yet I sometimes wonder what it would be like if my father was still alive. He would have met two more grandkids and witnessed all their silliness. Thankfully he saw his first grandchild and did something unfathomable for a Korean male of his generation... change a baby's diaper (which he was proud to share was a first for him).

#### **Associate Pastor's Report (cont.)**

It's hard to believe that it's been 13 years since my father passed away. Now I approach the realization that death is inevitable for my other parent. As I shared in last weekend's sermons, my mother was recently diagnosed with breast cancer. One of my first questions after hearing this news was "What are the treatment options?" However, my mom decided to not seek medical treatment. In late July, Ethan and I made a brief trip to Los Angeles to see my mother and brother. I wanted to learn more about my mom's decision and the cancer in her body. Moreover, I wanted to convince her to receive treatment. My mom shared various reasons for not doing so, including her friends' difficult experiences with unsuccessful medical procedures and the decline in her physical health. Unspoken yet present was the memory of my father's battle with cancer. I felt like I could show her that her situation does not have to end the same way. But she would not budge on her decision. Yet I could not accept that decision... at least not until she shared her peace with dying. She trusts her life in God's hand.

We don't know when death will come for her. My brother and I discussed how it might happen in a year, two, five or ten years. I don't know when that day will be. I also don't know when my last day will be. Maybe it's a good thing not to know when our last breath will be, otherwise we might be overwhelmed by the thought of death. Nonetheless, I am learning to be mindful of death as a part of life. Death reminds me that life is a precious gift. I wonder if I can go so far as to think of death as a gift, especially in light of Christ's death that gives us life with God.
