#### From the Pastor's Desk

This month's newsletter includes photographs of a recent infant baptism. It is a wonderful delight to celebrate this sacrament, even more so with two baptisms in two months: Sylas Micek in June and Jude Graybill in July. (Thank you Dylan & Miranda Micek and Marc & Megan Graybill for granting our church this blessing!)

While preparing for a recent sermon and thinking about infant baptisms, I was reminded of the 16<sup>th</sup> century Protestant Reformer, John Calvin. More specifically, I recalled Calvin's idea of divine accommodation and the following statement by him:

For who even of slight intelligence does not understand that, as nurses commonly do with infants, God is wont [that is, inclined] in a measure to "lisp" in speaking to us? Thus such forms of speaking do not so much express clearly what God is like as accommodate the knowledge of [God] to our slight capacity. To do this [God] must descend far beneath [God's] loftiness. (Institutes of the Christian Religion, 1.13.1)

We cannot grasp the greatness of God. It is only by God coming down to our level that we can know some measure of the divine. Calvin used the example of an adult who engages in "babytalk" with a child to explain God's willingness to accommodate human limitations. Without divine accommodation, God would be unknown to us in the sense that God is beyond our human understanding. Yet, God reaches down to our level.

More than knowing information about God, "baby-talk" is about connecting in a relationship. If you have spoken this *parentese* language, then I would guess it was for playing with a young child or getting their attention. There is love in humbly stating "goo goo gaga...". Similarly, there is love in Christ humbly becoming human, which is poetically described in Philippians 2:5-11.

<sup>5</sup> Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus,

<sup>6</sup> who, though he was in the form of God,

did not regard equality with God

as something to be exploited,

<sup>7</sup> but emptied himself,

taking the form of a slave,

being born in human likeness.

And being found in human form,

<sup>8</sup> he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death even death on a cross.

<sup>9</sup>Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name,

<sup>1°</sup> so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend,

in heaven and on earth and under the earth,

<sup>11</sup> and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

#### From the Pastor's Desk (cont.)

As recipients of God's loving accommodation (and Christ's emptying of himself), we ought to be more accommodating toward others. This does NOT mean that we should think of ourselves as being better/higher than other people. Rather, our accommodation is putting aside some of our preferences for the sake of building relationships. In Paul's words, it is becoming "all things to all people, that [we] might by all means save some." (1 Corinthians 9:22b).

I would like to thank everyone who has helped with our Annual Garage Sale. Through your donation-giving, sorting, cleaning, baking and praying, this year's sale looks to be a great success. Even before a sale has been made, it has been a delight to see church members come together for a common purpose.
