From the Pastor's Desk

Christmas decorations are going up. Radio stations are playing carols. Gifts are being wrapped, while Christmas letters are being written. We are now in the season of advent. For the most part, it is a joyful time of the year.

Yet, I am reminded that it is also a painful time. Got an email just yesterday from the Columbus Community Hospital titled, "Mental illness and suicide rates increase as the holiday season approaches." It mentioned the concerning rise in bankruptcy for farmers and ranchers. If you know of families that are going through these difficulties, here are phone numbers that were shared: "To reach someone on a free, confidential 24/7 line, call 1-833-FARM-SOS (1-833-327-6767). You can also call the Rural Response Hotline at 800-464-0258 or the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline at 800-273-8255."

End of year holidays can be very difficult because of the numerous reminders of loss, especially the loss of loved ones who are no longer at what are meant to be festive gatherings. Being mindful of this grief (as well as other forms of loss, such as employment, physical/mental ability or sense of purpose), we will be hosting a Blue (because the holidays can make some feel blue) Christmas service on December 16th (Thursday), 6:30pm with our ecumenical partners (First United Methodist, Grace Episcopal and St. Luke's United Church of Christ). Anyone is welcome to join this service as we bring our laments before God. If you need someone to talk with about your grief, please know that I can be a listening ear. You do not have to grieve alone.

I would like to share with you words from Carolyn Winfrey Gillette, a contemporary hymn writer:

How Can We Sing a Joyful Song?

O WALY WALY 8.8.8.8 ("Though I May Speak")

How can we sing a joyful song? O God, our sorrows hem us in. When pain and grief seem all too strong, How can we sing a joyful hymn?

The world around finds songs to sing Of laughter, mirth and happiness, But these sound false and even sting When what we feel is deep distress.

And yet, O God, we dare to sing For in our grief, we're not alone. You love this world and entered in By sending us your only Son.

You sent us hope - Emmanuel! O God-with-us, you bore our pain. And so we sing, for all is well! In Christ, we will be whole again.
