
From the Pastor's Desk

It is hard to believe that it has been over eight months since the coronavirus pandemic has significantly impacted our ministry. In one sense, it does not feel like that long ago when we initially canceled our in-person on March 15th. In another sense, it feels like this pandemic has been dragging on for too long – we all want this to be over with.

I have felt a similar ambivalence in relation to ministry for these pandemic months. On one hand, things don't seem that different from before. I have my regular meetings: whether it is weekly Bible studies, staff meeting, and worship services or monthly committee meetings. There are also events that happen on an irregular basis: for example, baptisms, weddings and funerals. These sacred moments happen with varying amounts of preparation. Weddings are prepared in months, baptisms in weeks and funerals in days. While it seems there have been too many deaths in recent months, it is hard to say there have been many more funerals than previous years (This is NOT to say that the pandemic is a hoax. There have been at least two deaths within our congregation related to COVID19, although they may not have been included in the current national count of over 250,000). The point I am trying to make is that ministry has continued during the past eight months.

Yet, ministry has not been the same. It is hard to say what is really different about ministry during this pandemic. Of course, the way we do certain things is noticeably different. For example, our in-person worship services have been modified for safety. We have added mask-wearing, hand-sanitizing and social distancing. As a precaution, we have removed service bulletins, pew Bibles, hymnals and friendship folders. We are still not singing during our worship service nor having coffee fellowship or potlucks after worship. These changes do not explain why ministry feels so different. It seems like they are related to the effects rather than the causes. What is at the root of why things feel so different in ministry?

Maybe it is the feeling of being disconnected from others? I recognized increasing levels of fatigue when we were only pre-recording our worship services. It was tiring to preach to an empty sanctuary. I was thankful when our Governing Council approved to re-open our in-person worship services (July 9th & 12th). It has been helpful to see faces (albeit partially covered) in our sanctuary. (continued on page 3)



This has led me to wrongly think that we are connected by a building (that is, by being in the same space). I am reminded that our faith is in God who is invisible. Just as I cannot see the One behind all that is good, loving, beautiful and true in life, I cannot see all the saints I am connected with. It has been immaturity on my part to seek sight over faith. This awareness has helped me to better

appreciate those who have participated in our worship services remotely due to concerns for safety of self and others. It is also preparing me for the real possibility of closing our in-person services again – if needed

Maybe it is the feeling of not knowing? In some ways, it is not knowing what things will be like



in the upcoming weeks and months. This upcoming season of Advent will be different from years past, and I am not sure how well things will work out with our new plans. I also wonder if/when we will return to certain worship activities like singing and handshakes for passing the peace. Yet, uncertainty about the future is nothing new; it has been a constant in life.

Maybe it is the feeling of not knowing how you all are doing? For those who attend our in-person worship services, post comments on our Facebook live streaming, stop by the church office on occasion, or contact via phone/email, I appreciate getting to know even just slightly how you have been getting through this time. Yet, for many others, I am sorry that I do not know how you are doing. I will try to do a better job of reaching out. At the same time, I ask that you share and let us know how things have been going for you.

Hopefully, our church can make a difference during this time of safedistancing. While we may feel separated (and maybe even isolated), we are united in Christ by the work of the Holy Spirit. Please let us know if there is any way we can help and, at the very least, as to how you are doing.



- 3) <u>ACH transfer</u> call Chrissy at the church office for information.




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Social Concerns and Missions Committee

Mission Study Summary

The Mission Study Committee which was made up of Julie Graham, Steve Heinisch, John McClure, Dave Melick, Lisa Perrin, Ashli Porter, Doug Williams and Marv Zoucha met during the months of February through October. The Mission Study was completed in October and was accepted by both the Governing Council and the Presbyterian Homestead Presbytery Committee on Ministry. This Mission Study is needed in order to move forward in the process for a permanent pastoral staffing plan for our church.

The Mission Study team conducted a survey of the congregation to get members' feed back on what their needs, desires and expectations are for Federated Church. From the survey responses we were able to divide the responses up according to five common themes that the members desired and expected from Federated Church.

Those themes were:

- <u>Spiritual Growth</u> by providing Bible-based sermons, Bible Study groups and educational programs for all ages.
- <u>Fellowship</u> by providing fellowship groups/activities within the church and in the community, as well as building relationships and providing a safe, nonjudgemental church family.
- <u>Missions</u> involvement for all ages in our church, community and the world, and encouraging community use of the church facilities.
- <u>Community of Faith and Compassion</u> can be provided by Federated Church by being welcoming, safe, inclusive, non-judgemental, and providing prayer, emotional support and a process of reconciliation.
- <u>Worship</u> which includes both traditional and contemporary music, provides opportunities for increased family involvement, is meaningful, and provides sermons which are applicable to our daily lives.

If you have any questions on the process used for the Mission Study or the results of the study, feel free to contact any of the committee members. If you would like to see the entire Mission Study document, please contact the church office and a copy of the Mission Study can be sent to you.

What's Next?

With the Mission Study Committee completing their work, the next phase (which has already started) is the Staff Planning Committee. The members of this committee, who include Doug Williams (Chair), Bob Arp, Deb Curry, Marcia Grant, Cola Hahn, Kathy Leischner, Tim Warren, Linda Wheatley and Marv Zoucha, agree their work should be finalized quickly. Once the staffing plan is done, the PNC (Pastor Nominating Committee) will be elected at the February 2021 Annual Congregational Meeting.
