From the Pastor's Desk

A CHURCH THAT PRAYS TOGETHER, STAYS TOGETHER

During the recent season of Advent, I was intrigued by how Jesus and John the Baptizer were intertwined in their life stories. They both were born miraculously. They were related through their moms, who were cousins. And they were similar in age with John about six months older than Jesus. At the same time, Jesus and John were clearly different: Jesus alone is the divine-human Messiah while John served as "forerunner."

There is a particular point of difference between Jesus and John that has intrigued me for several weeks. They are described as having differing approaches to ministry. John waited in the wilderness and welcomed those who sought to be baptized in the Jordan River. Jesus went out to various regions and helped those in need. In short, John waited for people to come to him while Jesus went to the people.

This contrast makes me think about the way our church approaches ministry. Like many mainline churches, we tend to be like John the Baptizer and expect people to come to us. Our building projects reflect the mindset, "If you build it, they will come." That seemed to have worked for a while but is no longer the case. Maybe we need a different approach to ministry; one that resembles Jesus reaching out. Our church should evangelize to those who are "unchurched."

Before we try to reach out to people who are not connected to a church, we need to do a better job of caring for people within our church. This is where your help is needed:

- If you attend our in-person worship service, please make sure to sign in the Friendship Folder.
- If you join our live-stream worship service, please write a comment (even a simple "Hi") or "like" the service.
- If you participate in our recorded worship service (online or on local broadcast TV), please send a quick email (fcstaff@federatdcolumbus.org) or call the church office (402-564-2812) to let us know.
- If you are choosing to be cautious during the current pandemic by not coming to in-person worship services and have difficulty participating in virtual services, please let us know.

All of this will help us to know who is (and is not) participating in our worship. Without the worship connection, it is easy for a church to lose touch with its congregants. With that in mind, we will be making efforts to reach out to those who have not participated in our worship for some time. We are called to care for one another.

Governing Council Meeting, January 25th

The January meeting of the Federated Church Governing Council was held on January 25. New members are Mark Weeder, John McPhail, Donna Augspurger, and VP Julie Graham. Carryover members are John McClure, Renee Norris, Alison Wagner, Jesse Abrego, Katie Claus, Mimi Ernst, Rev. Edward Yang, and President Wayne McCormick.

Finance and Property Committee Co-Chairs presented the November and December Financial Reports. They also presented a proposed church budget for 2022, which calls for a 0.9% increase over 2021. The council acknowledged and received the emailed Committee Minutes and the Pastor's written report.

The following motions were made and approved:

- -To approve the November Governing Council meeting minutes.
- -To receive the November and December financial reports.
- -To receive the Pastor's November and December Report
- -To recommend to the congregation approval of the 2022.budget, at the Feb 27 congregational meeting.
- -To approve the Communion calendar for 2022 as presented by the Worship and Music Committee.
- -To approve the Narthex Book Sale and the Mothers' Day Flower Sale by the youth as fundraisers for the 2022 Youth Triennium.
- -To approve the Souper Bowl of Caring fundraiser for the Platte County Food Pantry.
- -To approve the appointment of Bill Royer as Head Usher.and Louise Moran as Governing council secretary.
- -To approve the use of absentee voting with a requested ballot for the Annual Congregational Meeting on February 27.

Other items discussed were:

- -The Boy Scout charter was signed in December.
- -Appointed an Ad Hoc committee to review the Federated Church Constitution for possible updates and changes to be presented to the congregation in October.
- -The position of Church Historian has not been filled. The council wants to survey other churches to see what would be expected of the historian, other than the archiving of church documents performed by the staff.
- -Church staff evaluations were discussed and will be scheduled by the Pastor and the Personnel Committee. The Governing Council President and Pastor Edward will research and develop a plan to evaluate the pastor.
- -A letter was received from the Homestead Presbytery stating the Per Capita giving for our congregation for 2022 is \$6765.00 (\$45.10 per member)


Narthex Book Sale



Paws & Claws Adoption Center




