PASTOR'S REPORT

Federated Church generally follows the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL), a three-year schedule of selected Scripture readings. RCL was a collaboration among Catholic Bishops and Protestants churches (including Episcopal, Lutheran and Presbyterian) in the U.S. and Canada. Details of the RCL worth noting include:

- There are usually four readings for each Sunday/holiday: Old Testament, Psalm,
 Epistle (Letter), Gospel
- Three-year schedule is designated by the letters A, B & C
- Synoptic Gospels are the focus of each year: Matthew in Year A, Mark in Year B and Luke in Year C; Readings from the Gospel of John are scattered throughout three-year schedule.
- Each year begins with the first Sunday of Advent and concludes with the "Reign of Christ" (Sunday before next season of Advent).

Personally, I appreciate preaching from the lectionary because each week's Scripture has been selected for me, as opposed to me trying to figure out which passage from the entire Bible to preach on. From the selected lectionary readings, one passage is picked by the makers of Feasting on the Word curriculum (which we use for our weekly lectionary Bible study). With specific Scripture selected, I can focus on sermon preparation.

I share all this to say that for the month of July, we will NOT be using the RCL. There are times when it makes sense to do something different. For July, we will focus on people who demonstrated faith in God and describe how they showed that faith.

Since Brenda Sand and I are leading our summer youth mission trip, we will not be around for the couple weeks of worship (one Sunday and following week's Thursday). Thankfully we have very capable preachers in our congregation, and we get to hear God speaking through them. We will also have our youth mission team report about how they witnessed faith during the trip.

As we enter the month of July, I want to ask you: "Who modeled faith to you? How did that person show their faith in God?" You are welcome to send a written response and with your permission, we would love to share in the next newsletter.

DECODING THE LITURGICAL COLOR SCHEME

Green = Presence During the majority of the church year, which is commonly called "ordinary time", the color that you will find is green. Because the color green is so often associated with life, the use of green during the seasons and the time where there is "nothing special" going on in the life of the church (no big festivals or holiday) reminds us that God is present among us , breathing life into us and into our church.

INCLEMENT WEATHER ANNOUNCEMENT

In the event of dangerous weather during a church service, you will be instructed where to go for shelter at that time. If you are attending an event at the church outside of worship, please go to the Fellowship Hall to the storage area, or the restrooms right off the Narthex.
