

Dear Friends,

As we look ahead to Holy Week and Easter, it's easy to feel like Easter is the culmination of the long wait of Lent....and then what?

Be assured, the special opportunities to praise God and reach out to the community don't end after Easter Sunday!

It has become a tradition at Federated to have Jazz Sunday on the week after Easter. We will once again welcome musicians from the Columbus Jazz Orchestra in Sunday worship on April 8. Invite friends and family members to praise God with us accompanied by great sacred jazz and gospel tunes!

On Sunday, April 15, we welcome Rev. Helen (Penny) Greer and Kenneth Winston, who are both volunteers from Nebraska Interfaith Power and Light (IPL). The mission of IPL is "to facilitate the faith community's response to our changing climate through community programs, education, and advocacy. IPL is not funded by any one religious organization. Our goal is to encourage dialogue across the usual political and religious divides so that we can make real progress in addressing climate change for the state of Nebraska." On April 15, Rev. Penny will preach in the Sunday worship service, and she and Ken will bring an engaging and informative presentation from IPL to the Adult Education hour.

We will celebrate Children's Sunday on April 29 with Pastor Edward preaching and our children involved in special ways in the worship service. That same Sunday, I will be commissioned to the Mosaic Peacemaking Conference of the Presbyterian Church (USA) in Israel/Palestine. I will arrive in Israel/Palestine on Monday, April 30 and will return home Saturday, May 12.

During the Mosaic conference, I will be with church members and pastors from all around the U.S., travelling around the Holy Land and meeting with Jewish, Christian, and Muslim communities to learn about the complex religio-political situation of the region. Of course, we will walk where Jesus walked and ministered.

When I talked with Rev. Cindi Stewart of Columbus First United Methodist Church about her experience visiting the Holy Land several years ago, she said this: "All those sermons I heard as a child and youth growing up in church came alive, and a thousand future sermons were born." I look forward to sharing this experience of the Holy Land in my preaching and teaching.

Time for Bonding

On Feb. 23-24, our youth group participated in the 30 Hour Famine, organized by World Vision (pictured above). Many of our youth fasted for 30 hours to experience a bit of what many people around the world experience on a regular basis. We read the 2018 "Be Hungry Manifesto" which states, "The world easily ignores the homeless and the hungry, and it's the children who suffer most. But for 30 hours, we choose to come beside them with God's love." Along with fasting, we raised funds for World Vision hunger relief programs. Thanks to the generosity of our church members, we raised \$482 which more than doubles our goal. While we had plenty of time for bonding (with no school for Columbus schools), we were short on energy (not having eaten for many hours).

On March 4 Sunday, we had our annual youth church visitation trip. With a couple carloads of youth and adults, we drove to Christ Community Church in Omaha for a contemporary worship service. After lunch, we had

a great time of bonding while ice skating - some for the very first time (pictured right).

Hopefully the bonds that are formed in our youth group will endure well beyond the teenage years.
