PASTOR'S REPORT: LENTEN DEVOTION ON ISAIAH 40:11

He will feed his flock like a shepherd.

He will carry the lambs in his arms, holding them close to his heart.

He will gently lead the mother sheep with their young. (New Living Translation)

As a young Christian, I learned that God is with us. Yet I wondered what that meant since we cannot see God. There were times when God's presence felt distant, and I wondered, "God, are you really here?" This was especially true during the year I spent in Kenya, Africa. While there was excitement with graduating from college and preparing for next stage in life, there were difficulties with being far from home and not always seeing eye to eye with the missionary I was supposed to be assisting.

I did not have family or friends to turn to. I had to rely more upon God, which (looking back) was a blessing. One day, while reading Isaiah 40, I was struck by verse 11. It speaks of how God is like a shepherd - similar to the 23rd Psalm ("The Lord is my shepherd...). The statement that really surprised me was how God carries us close to God's heart. It describes how God is not only with us but also lovingly embracing us. With this verse, I could picture being picked up and carried close to God. Then the difficulties I faced felt less overwhelming.

As you continue in this season of Lent, I hope you will be encouraged to know that God is carrying you. May you feel that loving embrace close to God's heart.

Gracious God, we thank you for your unfailing love. Help us to grow closer to you as we recognize that you are always close to us. Amen.

PIPE ORGAN TASK FORCE UPDATE

The Pipe Organ Task Force held a Town Hall Meeting Presentation (Q & A Forum) on February 12th, 11 congregants attended. They then met and concluded that a survey would help figure out the best route as to the updating of the Moeller Pipe Organ. The survey was printed and handed out at the Annual Congregational Meeting, February 26th. The Task Force will meet on March 12 to discuss the outcome of the survey and their next plan of action. Did you know walking is mentioned over 200 times in the bible?

One of the most important things we can do for our bodies is to be active. For most of us the simplest form of activity is walking.







MARCH 2023 NEWSLETTER

DECODING THE LITURGICAL COLOR SCHEME

Purple = Preparation Purple is the color that is used during our seasons of preparation: Advent and Lent. During both of these seasons (the four Sundays before Christmas and the 40 days before Easter, respectively), we are to dedicate ourselves for the preparation of our hearts and minds for welcoming Christ.

Purple is also the traditional color of royalty, and so some give nod to this as a reason why we use purple during these seasons.

In some tradition, the color **blue** is used interchangeably with purple during the season of Advent.
