From the Pastor's Desk

This month I would like to highlight a couple other voices and not my own. The first is Lee Augustin, who serves as organist/pianist at Federated Church. We are thankful for her many decades of service. While we often get to enjoy her musical talents, it is a special treat to hear her words in a brief reflection. As Lee mentions, I asked during a sermon in a Thursday evening worship service about the experience of feeling close to God. I was surprised by Lee's response; it was one that I did not anticipate. After the service, I asked Lee if she would share in writing the story behind her answer. Thankfully, Lee agreed and her sharing is below.

The second voice comes from Ulrich Zwingli, who was a first-generation Protestant Reformer. In 1519, the bubonic plague (aka "Black Death") broke out in Zurich, Switzerland, where he was pastoring. While ministering to the people, Zwingli caught the disease to the point of near death. Thankfully, he recovered. During and after his illness, Zwingli wrote words to what is known as the "Plague Hymn/ Song," which is also shared below.

May you find encouragement from these voices during this season of Lent.

As Edward asked us in his recent sermon: "When have you felt closest to God?", poignant images instantly filled my head and heart. My answer: "In the death of a loved one." Confusing? In the death of a loved one? Contradictory? Allow me to share a personal experience from so many years ago which still remains very powerfully humbling and inspiring in my daily faith journey.

My mother had become ill quite suddenly... medicines and surgery proved unsuccessful followed by a week of rapid decline. Thus, the decision was made to transport her by ambulance back to my hometown hospital. There the staff settled her into a pri-vate room, and later my dad and brother left to purchase grocery needs. The atmos-phere was emotionally packed, yet calm, peaceful. Some minutes later, without any alert, my mother called out strongly as her upper body rose from the pillow, she lay back down, and then... she was gone.

That first year following her death was what many of us experience in painful events... disbelief, heavy questions, deep sadness. One day in the second year, however, I was shockingly overwhelmed with a capital letters, jaw-dropping Revelation... a huge "Duh" moment for me: That uniquely monumental April 18 afternoon had allowed me, just a regular, everyday person of sin, to be in the very room in the presence of God when He took my dear mother home!! Truly it was the epitome of love from our all-knowing God of Love... and further it was the power of motherhood faith who showed me, even in her death, the gift of belief in God above.

At the Beginning of the Illness Help, Lord God, help In this trouble! I think Death is at the door. Stand before me, Christ; For Thou hast overcome him! To Thee I cry: If it is Thy will, Take out the dart, Which wounds me Nor lets me have an hour's Rest or repose! Will'st Thou however That Death take me In the midst of my days, So let it be! Do what Thou wilt; Me nothing lacks. Thy vessel am I; To make or break altogether. For, if Thou takest away My spirit From this earth, Thou dost it, that it may not grow worse, Nor spot The pious lives and ways of others. In the Midst of His Illness

> Console me, Lord God, console me! The illness increases, Pain and fear seize My soul and body. Come to me then, With Thy grace, O my only consolation! It will surely save Everyone, who His heart's desire And hopes sets On Thee, and who besides Despises all gain and loss. Now all is up. My tongue is dumb, It cannot speak a word. My senses are all blighted. Therefore is it time

That Thou my fight Conductest hereafter: Since I am not So strong, that I Can bravely Make resistance To the Devil's wiles and treach-erous hand. Still will my spirit Constantly abide by Thee, how-ever he rages. During Convalescence Sound, Lord God, sound! I think I am Already coming back. Yes. if it please Thee, That no spark of sin Rule me longer on earth Then my lips must Thy praise and teaching Bespeak more Than ever before, However it may go, In simplicity and with no danger. Although I must The punishment of death Sometime endure, Perhaps with greater anguish Than would now have Happened, Lord! Since I came So near; So will I still The spite and boasting Of this world Bear joyfully for the sake of the reward By Thy help, Without which nothing can be perfect.

They have a number of animals available, including Ashly, Toodle, Baby J and Doodle.









- Chancel Flowers are given By John and Deb Curry in loving memory of J.R. Curry who has been gone 20 years on February 17th and is


always remembered by his family and friends.
