

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#### From the Pastor's Desk

One item that was missing in our annual meeting booklet was a pastor's report for 2019. I apologize for not having one ready in time. In some ways, I gave a four-month report in the June 2019 newsletter (if you would like a reprint of that, please let me or our office staff know). Thus for this newsletter I will share about the latter six months of 2019.

July at Federated will always be a special month. It is the month I began my call here – on July 15, 2016. Just as in past years, we had our annual Garage Sale around the time of my work anniversary. It was great to see church members coming together and laboring for a good cause. Thank you Bob Trautwein for chairing last year's Garage Sale.

A couple days after the Garage Sale, I got on a bus with nine of our youth (along with a bunch of other people from the Homestead Presbytery) to go to Purdue University for the Presbyterian Youth Triennium. It was my first time at this large gathering with about 4,000 attendees. What do I remember about Triennium? The worship services were amazing. Not only was it seeing thousands of youth worshiping God with one voice, it was seeing ways that traditional liturgy could connect with young people. I'm thankful for Federated's Youth Fund that covered the cost to send our youth and me to Triennium. Another significant event last July was our service date for Habitat for Humanity. We had a great crew that finished our tasks quickly, maybe even too quickly with work wrapped up before lunch time. I'm thankful for all our volunteers.

August 2019 was a bit quieter. There were some important activities like the diaper changing station and parade float for Columbus Days (thank you Membership & Growth Committee), but August felt like 'the quiet before the storm.' The approaching storm was the restart of our educational programs for children, youth and adults. At the Governing Council meeting that month, I shared how ministry felt like juggling. I was able to keep things going and even added a weekly Bible study on Tuesday afternoons and Wednesday evening (initially as a Summer Bible Study and now as our Lectionary Bible Study). However, the thought of getting everything ready for our education hour restart felt like I was about to juggle too many balls at once – with the fear that I might drop all of them. Our Governing Council elders agreed to the hiring of a Christian Education Director. With this support, I approached Brenda Sand about serving in this capacity. After having some time to discern, Brenda graciously agreed to take on this role and help me with my workload.

It felt like there was something special going on every week during September. We had our Education Hour Kick-Off on Sept. 8th with animals from the Horn T Zoo sponsored by our Christian Education Committee and BBQ lunch hosted by our Youth Ministry Committee. We also commissioned our teachers and student along with our Chancel Choir. On Sept. 15th, we provided Bibles for 3 years and 3rd graders as a way of following up our commitment to nurture the children in our care. We also commissioned our Bells of Joy. On Sept. 22nd, we commissioned our youth ushers and acolytes as their serve in worship. Last but not least, we had Heritage Sunday (in recognition of our 50+ year members) and 5th Sunday Potluck, both organized by our Membership & Growth Committee.

In October 2019, I spent a few days at the Lied Lodge for the Pastoral Leadership Revitalization program that I was accepted into. It was the first of many retreats spanning three years: family retreats in summer and pastors' retreats in the fall each year. In addition, I have been meeting with a mentor each month for an hour online coaching session. Thankfully, all expenses are covered by the Omaha Presbyterian Seminary Foundation. We also observed Children's Sabbath (where we recognize the needs of children around the world), held our Fall Congregational Meeting and hosted Trunk or Treat last October.

During the month of November, our youth group and I made a trip to New Life Presbyterian Church in Omaha (where Doug Williams' brother, Dwight serves as the pastor). We had a great time worshiping God with them during their Sunday worship. After lunch at the church, several of their youth joined us for miniature golf and snacks.

November also brought the wonderful treat of Cookies N'More with its impressive array of sweet delights. Along with being a great fundraiser, it was a great opportunity for church members to work together (like the Garage Sale). Thank you Alison Wagner and Paula Lange for co-chairing last year's Cookies N'More.

December 2019 was a month for advent: preparing for the arrival of Christ. Knowing that the holidays can be a sad time for people, we were blessed to host an ecumenical Blue Christmas Service on Dec. 12th. A few days later, we had our Children's Christmas Pageant which was the culmination of months' worth of skit practices – thank you Children's Ministry teachers and students! Also, on Dec. 15th, we have our All Church Christmas Caroling at several of the local senior centers – thank you Bob Arp for leading us in song.

Sunnie and I were able to do something different last Christmas. Since we were not flying on a plane that day, we helped out at our Community Christmas Dinner. It was a lot of work from 7:00am but well worth it. Thank you Chris Dixon for organizing this annual event. One of the great privileges of being a pastor is entering into sacred moments of life. We celebrated several confirmations in 2019: for Annie Lange, Macyn Norris, Mark Garcia Lopez and Riley Gausman. I also officiated wedding ceremonies for these beautiful couples: Amanda Volkmer with Ronald Zaim on August 24th and Kristen Augspurger with Jacob Frederick on November 16th. Along with these celebrations of new life, there were celebrations of completed life. I am tremendously grateful for the opportunities to preside over the memorial and/or graveside services for these beloved children of God: Jane Hopp, Robert Busler, Sam Scheidegger, John Ellefson, Janice Hayek, Don Schaufelberger, Carol Vollbracht and Charles Gray.
