FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

On the first Sunday of May, we have our Confirmation Sunday! It will be the day when confirmands will be officially welcomed as full members in our church. I must admit that the confirmation process is relatively new to me. In fact, I was never confirmed for two major reasons: the church of my youth did not have confirmation and my baptism happened during my college years.

Nonetheless, I have appreciated learning about the significance of confirmation. It is essentially a young person confirming their baptism. In most cases, confirmands (persons being confirmed) did not make a choice in being baptized as an infant. Since they are now in their adolescence, confirmands are ready to make a decision in confirming what others have previously decided for them. As a church, we want confirmands to make an informed decision and have provided confirmation classes.

Within the past ten years, Federated Church expanded confirmation classes from a one-year to a two-year program. I will admit there are times when I think it is great that we have plenty of time with confirmands and other times when it feels too long. It should be noted that our confirmation program is longer than many other churches. Based on what I know, confirmation programs range from three months to two years long. For us, confirmation classes occur during the 7th and 8th grade years for confirmands.

Since I arrived at Federated Church, I have taught confirmation classes. There have been several changes along the way. We had weekly classes on Sunday morning during Education Hour, then we had bi-weekly classes on Sunday evening, and then returned to weekly Sunday mornings. Initially, I taught confirmation by myself (with occasional guest lessons). Gratefully for the past several years, our Christian Education Director (Brenda Sand) has taught with me.

Another change has been our confirmation curriculum. I began using curriculum from our denominational publications before switching to an interdenominational resource. We currently use "Colaborate" curriculum from Sparkhouse which includes 15 lessons on the Old Testament, 15 lessons on the New Testament and 15 lessons on Presbyterian History and Doctrine (along with additional lessons on the United Church of Christ). As you might have noticed from reading the previous sentence, that is a lot of material to cover. I have realized that quantity of lessons might be too much and there are better uses for the time we have with confirmands. With that in mind, Brenda and I are planning for another update to our confirmation program for more balance between informing confirmands and forming community among them. All our changes have been attempts to improve upon what we have been doing.

Along with preparing and planning, we want to celebrate all that God has done for us. We especially rejoice for current confirmands as they join the church and thank confirmation mentors for their support. Interestingly, the word "confirm" comes from Latin <confirmare> which is the combination of con- "together" and firmare "strengthen". In other words, to be confirmed literally means to be strengthen together. Our church is strengthened by our confirmands, and we hope to continue in strengthening confirmands in their faith journey together with us.

DECODING THE LITURGICAL COLOR SCHEME

Church paraments are the cloths that adorn the lecturn, pulpit, communion table and other parts of a church sanctuary.

WHITE

White symbolizes purity, holiness, and virtue, as well as respect and reverence. White (and gold) represent days and seasons of joy and mark pivotal events in the life of Christ. They are used for all high Holy Days and festival days of the church year. The color white is used for Epiphany, the seven weeks of Easter, Christmas Eve through Epiphany, and the four transitional Sundays in Ordinary Time: Baptism of the Lord, Transfiguration of our Lord, Trinity Sunday, and Christ the King Sunday. White is also used for weddings and funerals.
