
Another mission trip to Kenya is in the works for 2019, and you can go meet these very children! They are all from one church, a tin shack that is filled with the spirit.

Matthew 25:45 "He will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me.'


