## From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends.

In one short verse, which reads as much like a poem as anything, the prophet Isaiah spans a lifetime:

For a child has been born for us,

A son given to us;

Authority rests upon his shoulders;

And he is named

Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God,

Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Christians read this verse and of course think of Jesus. For the Hebrew people of Isaiah's time, they were talking about someone in their time. One of the beauties of scripture is its impact on people throughout time.

Every generation hopes for leaders who are wonderful counselors and who bring peace. We reach out to God when we feel we can't do anymore, looking to God to be mighty. We know we are mortal — God is everlasting.

Advent and Christmas are the times when we most often read this verse from Isaiah, but it is a powerful verse all of the time.

For all of these reasons and more, we will use <u>Names for the Messiah</u> by Walter Brueggemann for our Adult Education Advent Bible Study.

Like people in Isaiah and Jesus' time, we are all particularly frustrated with leadership (or a lack thereof). Like people in Isaiah and Jesus' time, there is a severe distance between the "haves" and the "have-nots."

Isaiah and Jesus called the people of their time to action—faith in God that did not instigate faithful action was a frustration of both Isaiah and Jesus.

One of the beauties of scripture is its impact on people throughout time. I encourage you to participate in the Adult Education Advent Bible Study and to look for ways it can inspire you to faithful action.


## **Cent7er Volunteer**

## Fall Congregational Meeting Summary - written by 2017 President of GC, Rick Porter

The following is a summary of the message I delivered at the Fall Congregational meeting. 2017 has certainly been a year of growing pains but one where I feel we have moved in a great direction. 2017 saw the first full year of our staffing plan and the programs that were associated with it. I am so proud of the way this congregation steps up and supports Federated in Time Talent and Treasure and we should feel only humble gratitude in our giving. From the graphic below we see that contributions didn't keep up with expenses in 2017 although expenses have never exceeded the approved budget. As a result, the Governing Council took action in October to transfer about \$24,000 in undesignated reserves into the checking account. My estimate is that we will need an additional \$5000 to complete the year.

I invite you to join my wife and I in making an additional contribution in 2017 to finish out the year. I also encourage you to consider an increase - above the original "Live Generously" October Stewardship request of 3% - for your 2018 pledge. Let's ensure that we continue to support the programs and infrastructure of Federated Church for the future.
