Did you know that the highest officials in both of our church's denominations are women of color?

The 34th General Synod of the United Church of Christ (which met in July 2023) elected Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson as the General Minister and President. Rev. Thompson is the first woman and first African American to fill this position. Prior to taking on this role, she served as UCC Associate General Minister for Wider Church Ministries and Co-Executive for Global Ministries (for UCC & Disciples of Christ) since 2019. She also served in the UCC national office, as a church planter in Florida Conference and in family ministries in New York. Rev. Thompson began her role as UCC General Minister and President on August 1, 2023.

The 226th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) approved the nomination of Rev. Jihyun Oh as Stated Clerk of the General Assembly. Rev. Oh is the second woman (Rev. Bronwen Boswell served as Acting Stated Clerk from July 2023 – July 2024) and second person of color (Rev. J. Herbert Nelson, who is African American, served as Stated Clerk from August 2016 – June 2023) and first Asian American to fill the highest ecclesial office of the PC(USA). Prior to taking on this role, Rev. Oh served as Director of Mid Council Ministries and Associate Stated Clerk in the Office of the General Assembly since 2019. She also served as presbytery moderator, interim pastor, hospital staff chaplain and associate pastor. Rev. Oh began her role as Stated Clerk of the General Assembly on August 1, 2024.

On a personal note, I got to know Rev. Oh at the Synod of Lakes and Prairie's Leadership Summit in Buffalo, MN this past April. We shared several connections: both of us were born in South Korea, grew up in Korean immigrant churches and have ties to the Midwest: Rev. Oh grew up in Kansas, while my family and I have been in Nebraska over eight years now.

I am excited for how God will work through Rev. Thompson and Rev. Oh for our denominations and churches.



FEDERATED CHURCH'S HELPING HANDS FUNDS

Did you know... "In the spring of 1975 Federated Church hosted and helped organize the Helping Hands Organization of Columbus..."¹ This gathering collaborated the efforts of a number of community groups and created low-cost housing, as well as a number of other wonderful outreaches to our community. This is where our "Helping Hands" funds were started!



For the year of 2024, we have received donations equaling \$1,815.00! As of July 31st, we have helped fourteen people with fuel, one member with food, one person with rental assistance, one member with an anxiety vest, and donated \$350 to the Brian Marker Benefit that was held in January, for a total of \$788.14.
