#### From the Pastor's Desk

Where were you on 9/11?

It is difficult to believe it has been twenty years since that shocking day. I can still remember that day vividly...

My wife and I were newlyweds and even newer residents in Vancouver, Canada. My first day of studies at Regent College was on Sept. 11, 2001. I got up early that morning to get ready and take the public bus to the University of British Columbia campus from our apartment in the Granville district. My first class that morning was a seminar on John Calvin's Institutes of the Christian Religion with professor J.I. Packer. Before instruction began, the professor prayed which would be common for a seminary class. Strangely, there was mention of a plane crash in New York City. I did not think much of it at that time.

Later that morning, there was a chapel service. It was surprisingly packed but maybe expected for the first week of school. There were numerous comments about what happened in NYC and other East Coast cities interspersed among the prayers. I had a fuzzy picture in my mind of what was going on. It was not until I got home that afternoon and turned on the TV that I realized what happened. There was the initial feeling of disbelief: watching the planes crash into the Twin Towers seemed like a scene from a Hollywood movie. But then watching those buildings collapse, I felt my heart sink.

Horrible destruction and loss of lives on 9/11 are unforgettable and irreplaceable. Some may wonder where was God on that day. The best answer I have found is from a prayer: "... we acknowledge, O Lord, that on that day of human carnage yours was the first heart to break." In other words, God was there when the Twin Towers were struck and collapsed, God was there when Flight 77 hit the Pentagon, and God was there when Flight 93 crashed on a field instead of the hijackers' target.

From the ashes, we learned of inspiring stories of courage. There were passengers on Flight 93 who valiantly prevented further death and destruction. There were first responders who bravely ran toward damaged buildings while others were fleeing. These courageous deeds were followed by countless acts of mercy as people worked together to rebuild.

Each year around 9/11, I think back to the events of that day. I also consider what has happened since that time, like the birth of our children. I have even wondered where I will be in the future on particular anniversaries. On this 20th anniversary of a day marked by sorrow as well as hope, I am thankful to be here and serving as your pastor.


The Center's needs often change due to shortages or surpluses of certain items.
